The College Park Boys Soccer program is supported by the Cavalier Boys Soccer Booster Club. The Club is incorporated in the state of Texas, exclusively for charitable and educational purposes as defined in Section 501 (c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. The purposes of the Club are:

1. To promote and support the Woodlands College Park High School Boys Soccer program;
2. To assist, as needed, in any College Park Boys Soccer activity;
3. To develop and promote good fellowship, encourage sportsmanship and support activities and programs for the benefit of the boys' soccer team of CPHS;
4. To raise funds and purchase personal property and services to be used for the benefit of the Boys Soccer program at CPHS.

Booster Club Commitments

1. **Dues:** Annual dues for the Booster Club are \$ 75 per family. Dues are payable by December. You are encouraged to discuss your personal financial situation with Coach Owens or any Booster Club officer if needed.
2. **Concession Stand:** The concession stand is a major source of funding for the Booster Club and its activities. We request that each family work in the concession stand twice during the season.
3. **Get involved:** Come to games and cheer for your teams! Volunteer to help wherever you can – join a committee (or two), host a pasta dinner, run the clock, take and share photos, come to the monthly meetings. There are many ways you can contribute!

Committee Descriptions

Kick-off Dinner

We will have a family dinner to kick-off the new season shortly after the formation of the new teams. This is an opportunity to meet the players and their families and build team unity in a casual social setting. The committee takes care of the logistics, organizes the meal and publicizes the event.

Apparel

We select and sell apparel, yard signs and logo items for the benefit of the team and the booster club. This includes both required (game-days polos) and optional items. This committee decides what to sell, who the supplier will be, sets the prices, takes the orders, and distributes the items to the players and parents.

Banquet

We will celebrate the season with an end-of-the-season banquet in late April. This is free for the players, but friends and family will need to purchase tickets to attend. This committee plans and coordinates this event. This includes finding and booking the venue, arranging the food catering, decorating for the event, and coordinating the volunteers.

Concessions

We operate the concession stand for all home games at CP (but not Woodforest). The committee is responsible for the stocking of food and condiments, and coordinates the volunteers who work at the stand.

Program

We join with the Girls Soccer Team to produce an annual soccer program. One copy of the program is included in the cost of the Booster Club membership. The committee coordinates with Ann Smith and the Girls Soccer Booster Club representative to compile the content, sell advertising space, publish and distribute the program.

Spirit / Publicity / Special events

This committee publicizes the program and sponsors events and activities that boost team spirit. In the past, this has included posting signs to publicize games, decorating lockers and providing treat bags, submitting articles to local media outlets, and collecting stories, articles and pictures from media outlets. Special events have included Senior Night, Teacher Appreciation Night, and Youth Soccer Nights.

Pasta Nights

Varsity players are encouraged to attend pasta night dinners held on the day before selected games. The boys must pay \$2 for the meals (UIL rules). It is a great opportunity for the boys to hang out as a team and for the host to get to know the players better. The chairperson is responsible for organizing volunteers to host the dinners and provides guidance to the hosts on their responsibilities.

Game-Day Sandwiches

Players are able to purchase meals to take with them for away games. The chairperson selects the restaurant to cater the food, helps to coordinate the food choices and prices and collects the money from the players.

Academic Eligibility

CISD enforces the “No Pass, No Play” rule for all activities including Boys Soccer. All players must have a 70 average or higher in all courses to be eligible to play. Players are eligible for play in January based on the 9 week grading period ending December 20th. Grades are reviewed every three weeks throughout the season.

Bus Policy

The boys are required to ride with the team to and from all away games. They will be notified by the coach before the game when they are required to be at the school. They will be left if they are not on time and they will not play if they do not ride the bus with the team.

CP Jackets/Letters

The coach sets the requirements for lettering and the award of jackets.

- Jacket Policy – CISD will pay for one jacket only. Jackets can be earned for academics, athletics or activities. The sponsor of the activity will inform the student that they are eligible for a jacket and when they can be ordered.
- Letter Policy- Letters are given for Varsity play only.

Directions to fields

Links to field locations can be found on the website, but please be aware: field locations can and often do change due to field availability, field conditions and weather. Check before you leave for the game!

District Games

CPHS competes in Region 2, District 14-5A. Other teams in the District are College Station A & M Consolidated, Bryan, Conroe, Lufkin, Oak Ridge, and The Woodlands. CPHS plays each district team twice, once at home and once away. District games begin on February 4th and end on March 21st.

Dress Code

Game-day polo shirts should be worn to school on Tuesdays by all players when there is a game that evening. Coat and tie should be worn by all players to school on Fridays when there is a game that evening.

Penalty Card Policy

Under UIL rules, penalty points are accumulated throughout the season when cards are assessed to a player. A yellow card is worth one (1) point; a red card is worth five (5) points.

- when a player accumulates five (5) points, that player cannot play in the next game;
- when a player accumulates ten (10) points, that player cannot play in the next two (2) games;
- when a player accumulates fifteen (15) points, that player cannot play in the next three (3) games.

Points are reset to zero (0) at the beginning of the play-offs.

A player who receives a yellow card must leave the field for at least the next play.

A player who receives a second yellow card in a game must leave the field and cannot reenter the game.

However, a replacement player can be put on the field.

A player who receives a red card in a game must leave the field and cannot reenter the game. In addition, the team must play a man down from that point on.

State Playoffs

The top four teams in the district standings advance to the state play-offs. The first round of the state play-offs will be held on March 27-29, 2014. Teams that win will advance to the next round. The finals will be held April 17 – 19, 2014.

Uniforms

Uniforms will be distributed in December after teams are formed. These should be returned in clean condition after the end of the season. Game day socks must be purchased by players and are theirs to keep after the season. Uniforms including warm-up jackets and pants are to be worn only for games and other times designated by the coaching staff.
